Vets in action Peter Kaneen took second place in the open men's 5km walk at Victoria Park, East London in 23.41.

Paul Cubbon represented Great Britain in the Triathlon age group world championships in Vancouver and came 41st in 1:53.46

Ray Pitts won the Blackpool 50 mile walk in 8:58.44 with Simon Cox coming 5th . They were 1st and 2nd in their M55 age group.

Bethany Clague has been nominated for a "Pride in Mann" award after her amazing 170 mile walk twice around the Parish route, which caused such interest and switchboard jamming on the radio at the time. Her walk proved inspirational to many, and she has raised a great deal of money for the hyperbaric chamber.

Rob Sellors ran 60 miles along the Manx coastline to raise money for IOM Children's Centre.

The "new look" South runs are being held under the umbrella of our Club in order to raise money for the charity "Sport Erin", which has been set up to provide facilities for athletes in the South of the Island. For those of you who are concerned about how our funds are spent, it does not cost our Club anything. The next run is scheduled for Tuesday 26 August.

Alan Pilling, the winner of the Shield in 2007, is the only one to have competed in all of the ten on-island races which have taken place so far.

The three Great South Run 10k races have been added to the list of counting events plus the Northern 10k which is a re-incarnation of the old Ramsey Commissioners Road Race, the only difference being that it is now an accurately measured 10k rather than the old 10.166k.

WHITE AND HEALTHY END TO END WALK

Congratulations to those walkers (and officials) who survived the atrocious weather conditions to finish this year's Parish Walk, everyone a hero.

For the many however, who entered the Parish but were injured shortly before the event and had to watch from the sidelines, then how about getting rid of your frustrations by looking forward to tackling another long distance classic, namely the End to End.

Organised by the IOM Veteran Athletics Club, the event this year, once again sponsored by Ramsey Bakery, takes place on Sunday 21st September at 8.00 a.m. starting at the Point of Ayre. The course is approximately 39.2 miles long and follows a route down the west of the island, finishing at the Sound cafe.

Entry forms and all other relevant information for the walk can be downloaded from www.iomvac.co.uk - forms are either available in Word or PDF format. Alternatively, if you wish to a form to be sent to you this can be arranged, more details will follow shortly.

The End to End site is excellent and gives interesting statistics of previous winners and times etc. The entry fee this year is £15. Transport is available if needed to the start of the race. Males and females under the age of 21 must stop at Peel (about 22.1 miles). Like last year there is a 20 km race as part of the event, which finishes just past Ballaugh Cronk. Last year saw Robbie Callister chalk up his 6th successive victory since the event started in 2002 using the western route. Robbie actually broke the record last year by recording 6 hours 56mins 26 secs. Can anyone stop him winning his 7th E2E this year?

I think this years race could be a cracker as there are possibly 7 walkers who could challenge for honours in the mens race this year. Robbie Callister, Sean Hands, Jock Waddington, Michael George, Ray Pitts, Mark Hempsall, plus possibly Peter Kaneen if he decides to it and who knows Steve Partington may decide to give it a go.

In the womens race, if she decides to enter, Sue Biggart probably would start favourite, but if she doesn't walk then we could see a new winner.

Janice Quirk must feel confident that she can win this year but she will have Alison Brand and Jane Mooney to contend with should they both start. And if Marie Jackson decides to enter then look out.

Either way it looks to be a great line up and I would venture to suggest that this year we will see a new winner in both male and female and possibly 2 new records.

The event grows in stature each year, and with enthusiasm for long distance walking in the Isle of Man at an all-time high, another record entry is anticipated. Get your entry in today! Further information will be posted on a regular basis both on this forum and in the local media during the 3 months leading up to the event.

Murray Lambden was a worthy winner in the marathon coming in at 2:47.49 and winning the Manx Championship as well as setting a new age group record and becoming the oldest marathon winner.

The women's winner also set a new course record. Triathlete Paul Cubbon was the first Club member home, in 3:11.40 to claim 8th place, followed closely by Headmaster Rob Sellors in 9th place in 3:11.51. Both Paul and Rob were being filmed during the race by Fox TV for a short documentary in a series they are making. Unfortunately not likely to be shown in the UK. The race sponsor, David Salter was the 3rd member home in 49th place. 98 runners completed the marathon. There were 2 notable multimarathon runners, Steve Edwards completing his 454th event and Peter Ferris his 312th. (More about Peter Ferris below). This is the first year we have used electronic timing.

There were 210 finishers in the half marathon which was won by Wesham RR member Charlie Pass in 1:16.48. First lady home was Gail Griffiths in 1:31.06.

They have been commissioned by IAAF to produce a series of short films about running events around the world – and they decided to include our marathon. The films will be broadcast on Fox Sport in America and hopefully also Sky TV around Europe.

Apart from plenty of general shots during the event, the producer focussed on three of our runners. One man from Texas who was here for his 90th marathon and two local runners – Rob Sellors and Paul Cubbon – who quite coincidentally happen to be members of IOMVAC, so I trust that they said nice things about our race!

I should have a copy of the finished film late this year or early in 2009 and then it can go on our website. Hopefully it will be a great promotion for our event and also the island in general.

One last very important thank you to Dave Salter who is one of our club members and also our generous sponsor for the event through his company Salclear. And the best piece of news I have received this week is that Dave has agreed to sponsor the event again for 2009.

That's the most difficult bit of marathon planning 2009 out of the way then!
